

MUNICIPALITY OF NORTHERN BRUCE PENINSULA PARKING PASSES

A Parking Pass is designed to offer access to Municipal Parking Lots and other on- street parking spaces in Tobermory. The Pass is an exemption from paying the parking fee only. All other provisions of the Parking By-law shall apply.

HOW DO I OBTAIN A PARKING PASS?

	Residents may apply in person, Monday through Friday, between the hours of 8:30 a.m. and 4:30 p.m.	
What do I bring?	<p>Resident/Property Owner—the vehicle ownership and a valid photo identification piece issued by the Province of Ontario (such as a Driver's Licence) or a current year Tax Bill and the vehicle ownership. In the case of leased residential property, please provide a copy of the lease agreement or proof of tenancy, as well.</p> <p>Non-resident—a valid photo identification piece issued by the Province of Ontario (such as a Driver's Licence) and the vehicle ownership. A \$100.00 fee is applicable.</p> <p>Commercial—a valid photo identification piece issued by the Province of Ontario (such as a Driver's Licence) and the vehicle ownership. A \$300.00 fee is applicable.</p>	

NOTES:

- The Parking by-law restricts the number of passes to up to two (2) per property. If the multiple properties are owned by one person, only two (2) passes, maximum, will be issued. In the case of properties registered as corporate names, proof showing the principals of that corporation will be required to be provided before a pass is considered for issuance.
- Additional Parking Passes are available for purchase subject to meeting the aforementioned requirements and applicable fees.
- Each Parking Pass will be associated to a specific licence plate (not to a property or a person).
- Parking Passes are valid from May 15 to October 15, 2017. Paid parking is not in effect outside these dates.
- A Parking Pass must be hanging either on the rear view mirror or placed on the driver's side of the vehicle's dashboard. The licence plate number on the pass must be clearly visible from the outside of the vehicle.
- A Northern Bruce Peninsula-issued Parking Pass is not valid for use other than stated herein.
- Complete Parking Pass details are set out in By-law No. 2017-19 which is available on the Municipal website for viewing (under Council, then select By-law Index, proceed to 2017 By-laws).
- A parking pass does not, at any time, guarantee an available parking space.
- The pass will become invalid if altered in any way.
- Under no circumstances will parking and/or parking pass fees be refunded.
