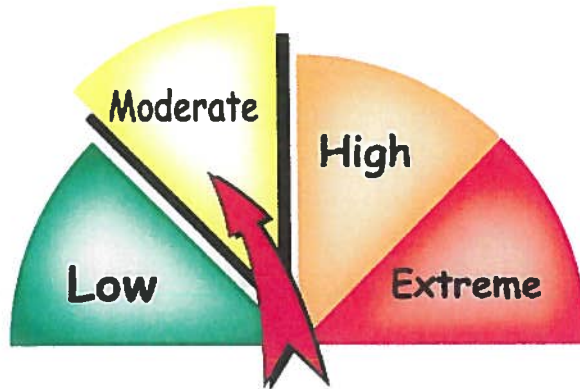


## Fire Rating for the Municipality of Northern Bruce Peninsula

### Current Fire Hazard Rating



#### FOREST FIRE RATINGS

<b>LOW</b>	No daytime burning is allowed, unless authorized by a Permit (check with Northern Bruce Peninsula Fire & Emergency Service) <u>Approved</u> incinerators and camp fires are allowed
<b>MODERATE</b>	No daytime burning is allowed, unless authorized by a Permit (check with Northern Bruce Peninsula Fire & Emergency Service) <u>Approved</u> incinerators and camp fires are allowed
<b>HIGH</b>	<b>NO OPEN BURNING</b> , including incinerators. Burn Permits are <b><u>SUSPENDED</u></b> Camp fires for cooking and warmth <b><u>ONLY</u></b> are permitted
<b>EXTREME</b>	<b>NO OPEN BURNING</b> . Camp fires <b>NOT</b> allowed. 'Organized Campgrounds' should contact the Northern Bruce Peninsula Fire & Emergency Service 519-793-3522 x 233 to determine their specific requirements.
<b>FIRE BAN</b>	<b>TOTAL FIRE BAN - NO OPEN BURNING</b>

Northern Bruce Peninsula Fire & Emergency Service, again this year, adopt a common Forest Fire Rating System, in an effort to help the residents and visitors to our area better understand the Fire Rating in effect.

**Fire Ratings Boards can be found at the following locations:**

- Highway #6 near Lawrence Road
- Municipal Office, 56 Lindsay Road #5
- Intersection of Highway #6 and Eliza Street – Tobermory
- Sunset Drive – Pike Bay
- Bruce Road 9 at TSBP/MNBP

After November 1st and until March 31st burning permits are not required for small burns.
